# Richard Wagner's house in Meudon by Brian Jupp

On a recent trip to Meudon, to give a talk on the time Richard Wagner lived in Meudon in 1841, I was fortunate to have been invited into the house where Wagner lived. All that remains from his time is the front wall. The present owner, author Agnes Soulez Lariviere, had the inside designed in the nature of the interior of a ship. Even the lounge window is in the shape of a sail.

Most appropriate, because it was here that Wagner wrote his first great opera, 'The Flying Dutchman', the story of the phantom ship, whose Captain was doomed to sail the seven seas for eternity when he made a pact with the Devil.
